PRELUDE, WELCOME, AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION (LBW p. 56)

Matthew 28:19; 1 John 1:8-10

Please stand as you are able.

In remembrance of Baptism, you may sign a cross on your chest or forehead. We gather to worship the One true God – the Father, the + Son, and the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

We keep silence for self-reflection and contrition.

#### Most merciful God,

we confess that we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name. Amen.

Almighty God, in his mercy, has given his Son to die for us and, for his sake, forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained minister of the Church of Christ, and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**



# GOD SPEAKS TO US IN HIS WORD

FIRST READING: Exodus 34:29-35

<sup>29</sup>When Moses came down from Mount Sinai, with the two tablets of the testimony in his hand as he came down from the mountain, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. <sup>30</sup>Aaron and all the people of Israel saw Moses, and behold, the skin of his face shone, and they were afraid to come near him. <sup>31</sup>But Moses called to them, and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses talked with them. <sup>32</sup>Afterward all the people of Israel came near, and he commanded them all that the Lord had spoken with him in Mount Sinai. <sup>33</sup>And when Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil over his face. <sup>34</sup>Whenever Moses went in before the Lord to speak with him, he would remove the veil, until he came out. And when he came out and told the people of Israel what he was commanded, <sup>35</sup>the people of Israel would see the face of Moses, that the skin of Moses' face was shining. And Moses would put the veil over his face again, until he went in to speak with him.

# SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 3:12-13, 4:1-6

<sup>12</sup>Since we have such a hope, we are very bold, <sup>13</sup>not like Moses, who would put a veil over his face so that the Israelites might not gaze at the outcome of what was being brought to an end. <sup>1</sup>Therefore, having this ministry by the mercy of God, we do not lose heart. <sup>2</sup>But we have renounced disgraceful, underhanded ways. We refuse to practice cunning or to tamper with God's word, but by the open statement of the truth we would commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God. <sup>3</sup>And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. <sup>4</sup>In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. <sup>5</sup>For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. <sup>6</sup>For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark the ninth chapter.




#### GOSPEL READING: Mark 9:2-9

<sup>2</sup>After six days Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, <sup>3</sup>and his clothes became radiant, intensely white, as no one on earth could bleach them. <sup>4</sup>And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, and they were talking with Jesus. <sup>5</sup>And Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah." <sup>6</sup>For he did not know what to say, for they were terrified. <sup>7</sup> And a cloud overshadowed them, and a voice came out of the cloud, "This is my beloved Son; listen to him." <sup>8</sup>And suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone with them but Jesus only. <sup>9</sup>And as they were coming down the mountain, he charged them to tell no one what they had seen, until the Son of Man had risen from the dead.



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

#### GREAT THANKSGIVING (LBW p. 68)




PREFACE (LBW p. 68) Sung or spoken by the pastor.

thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.


Give us this day our daily bread;


- If you require gluten-free wafers or abstain from wine, indicate so to the pastor.

#### RITE FOR THE BURNING OF PALMS

#### INVOCATION

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Let us pray. Holy God, you sent your Son into this world to save humanity from the power of sin, death, and the devil. In the last week of His life, He courageously obeyed your holy will and when the praise turned to persecution, He endured it to the end. Grant that as we draw close to the Lenten season, we might ponder anew the suffering and death of Christ. Draw us closer to your heart and remind us of your neverfailing love for your whole creation as is evidenced in Jesus' sacrificial death on the cross. In His holy and precious name we pray. **Amen.** 

#### BURNING OF THE PALMS

John 12:13

When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on the colt of a donkey, the crowds that had gathered for the Passover Feast waved palm branches, cheered and shouted, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."

Each person places a palm into the basin, one at a time, saying: **Hosanna to the King of kings.**Once all of the palms are in the basin, they are set aflame, and we watch as they burn to ash.

#### **INSTRUCTION**

Ashes are a sign of repentance, cleansing, and renewal, as well as a symbol of our grief. We grieve the fact that we have sinned and caused a separation between ourselves and our Creator. We repent of our inability to follow Jesus the way that we should, and we are sorry for our constant need to be in charge. We lament our lack of faith and trust in God, who is always trustworthy and true.

The ashes that we have made today through the burning of these palms will be a sign for us, as the people of God, that we are forgiven and restored in Christ Jesus our Lord. When we hear the words, "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return," we are reminded of God's mercy in our lives. He who created the universe with a word, also spoke each of us into existence, to live in blessed union with Him and with one another. **Thanks be to God.** 

#### **BLESSING AND DISMISSAL**

May God - the Father, + Son, and Holy Spirit - bless us and be with us through our Lenten journey and forever. **Amen.** 

Let us go now in peace, confident in the love, mercy, grace, and new life given to us by God the Father, in the power of the Holy Spirit, and through Christ Jesus our Lord. **Thanks be to God.**
